Same-Sex Union A crowning (marriage) service for same-sex couples in the Orthodox Church

The following service has been used by same-sex couples desiring an Orthodox service to celebrate their union. It is a compilation of several services used for the "Rite of Brotherhood" (*Adelphopoiesis* or *Bratotvorenie*). While the nature and historical purpose of the service is widely debated, the service is appropriate for use in the Orthodox Church by same-sex couples desiring to be joined together in a holy union.

The translations were taken from the appendices of John Boswell's book "Same Sex Unions in Pre-modern Europe. Villard Books, New York, 1994.

This service is based on a rite of the Eastern Orthodox Church dating from between the fourth and ninth centuries. The service is very similar to every wedding performed in the Orthodox Church up until the present day. Variations of this particular sacred service have been used throughout the Orthodox world to unite Christians of the same sex who love one another and desire to share in the struggles as well as the rewards of life. David and Jonathan from the books of Samuel are invoked as they loved each other as they loved their own soul. The saint-martyrs Sergius and Bacchus are invoked. They were united in spiritual brotherhood "not bound by the law of nature but by the example of faith in the Holy Spirit". These saints were tortured and martyred late in the third century when they refused to worship the emperor's pagan idols. In their biography by another saint of the church, they are described as sweet companions and lovers to each other.

The ceremony begins at the doors of the Church

Priest: Blessed is our God always, now and ever and unto the ages of ages. **All:** Amen

Reader: Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal One, have mercy upon us! (3x)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen

All Holy Trinity, have mercy on us.Lord forgive our sins.Master, pardon our transgressions.Holy One, visit and heal our infirmities for your name's sake.

Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

Glory to the Father and to the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

- **Priest:** For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.
- All: Amen.

Priest: Let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: O Lord Our God, who granted unto us all those things necessary for salvation and bid us love one another and forgive each other our failings, bless and consecrate, O kind Lord and lover of good, these your servants NAME and NAME who love each other with a love of the spirit and have come into this your holy church to be blessed and consecrated. Grant to them unashamed fidelity and sincere love and as you granted to your holy disciples and apostles your peace and love, bestow them also on these your servants , O Christ our God, affording to them all those things needed for salvation and life eternal. For you are the light and the truth, and yours is the glory of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.

All: Amen.

The rings are then sprinkled with holy water.

These rings are blessed by the power of the Holy Spirit and the sprinkling of this holy water in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- All: Amen.
- **Priest:** Let us pray to the Lord.
- All: Lord, have mercy.
- **Priest:** By your blessing, O God, may these rings be unto **NAME** and **NAME** symbols of unending love and faithfulness, reminding them of the covenant they have made this day.

The priest now takes one ring, blesses NAME with it, and says

The priest then places the ring on NAME finger.

The priest then places the ring on NAME finger

Priest: Lord our God, bless the covenant of your servants **NAME** and **NAME**, and make the words of commitment they have spoken a reality. Sustain them with the holy union that comes from you. Lord our God, who extends your faithfulness to your inheritance and your own promise to your servants, your chosen ones in every generation: look kindly upon your servants NAME and NAME. and make good their pledge in trust, concord, fidelity, and love. For you, Lord, have declared that pledges be given and faithfully received. By a ring, authority was given to Joseph in Egypt. By a ring Daniel was exalted in the land of Babylon. By a ring Tamar's innocence was proven. By a ring, our heavenly Father showed compassion for his prodigal son, for he said, "Put a ring on his right hand, kill the fatted calf, and let us celebrate." Your own right hand, O Lord, armed Moses in the Red Sea. And just as your faithful word established the heavens and the earth. so too will your mighty word and your uplifted arm bless the right hands of your servants. Therefore, O Master, with a heavenly blessing now bless this putting on of rings, and may your Angel go before your servants all the days of their lives. For you are the One who bless and sanctify all things, and we send up glory to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever.

All: Amen.

The Procession

During the procession, Psalm 132 is sung

How good and how pleasant it is, when brothers live in unity! It is like precious oil upon the head, running down upon the beard, running down upon Aaron's beard, upon the collar of his robes. It is like the dew of Hermon which falls on the heights of Zion. For there the Lord gives his blessing, life forever.

The priest leads the couple to the Gospel Stand where the Holy Gospel has been set. They that are to be joined together are given lighted candles.

Keep their life together without reproach; give them dew from heaven and the fruitfulness of the earth; provide them with an abundance of temporal good things, that they in turn may share their abundance with those in need; and grant to every here present with them all that is necessary for salvation. For you are a merciful, generous God, and a lover of mankind; and we give glory to you, together with your eternal Father and your all holy, gracious, and live-giving Spirit, now and always and unto the ages of ages.

The priest places a crown on the head of each partner, intoning for each:

Forgive as the Lord has forgiven you. Over all these virtues put on love, which bind the rest together and makes them perfect. Christ's peace must reign in your hearts, since as members of the one body you have been called to that peace. Dedicate yourselves to thankfulness. Let the word of Christ, rich as it is, dwell in you. In wisdom made perfect, instruct and admonish one another. Sing gratefully to God from your hearts in psalms and hymns and inspired songs. Whatever you do, whether in speech or in action, do it in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Give thanks to God the Father through him! (Colossians 3: 12-17)

The priest leads the couple around the Gospel stand three times while the following hymns are chanted:

O Lord, O Lord, look down from heaven and see, and visit this vineyard and protect this vine which your right hand has planted.

O holy Martyrs, you have suffered courageously and received your reward; pray to the Lord our God to have mercy upon us.

Glory to you, O Christ our God, the glory of the Apostles, the joy of the Martyrs, who proclaimed the consubstantial Trinity.

Rejoice, O Isaiah! The Virgin is with child and shall bear a Son, Emmanuel. He is God and man: Orient is his name! By extolling him, we also praise the Virgin.

When the procession is completed, the priest removes the crowns
